

Our **Creating an Evangelism Culture** event is aimed at key leaders (or potential leaders) in your church. Having spent more than half his life in full-time evangelism, both locally and nationally, Mark uses biblical principles

in conjunction with life experience to inspire churches to become more outward-looking. He shows how mindsets can be changed and demonstrates how a change of culture will naturally follow. Mark has worked with many churches and has helped to facilitate significant change over the years.

Mark explores how churches can develop a sowing as well as a reaping attitude to

helps churches build an effective pattern of evangelism. In other words, it helps them find out what works and then supports them in carrying it out. Many churches Mark has worked with have likened the transition they have seen to that of a boot camp. The aim is to inspire and then to equip.

**Creating an Evangelism Culture** can be delivered during an evening session or over a couple of evenings, although this will limit opportunities for prayer and discussion.

Mark is happy to work around you, but Saturday slots from 10am to 3pm have proven to be most effective in the past. If this format suits, Mark is happy to speak at your church over a few Saturdays, helping to create a positive feeling about evangelism.

A recent YouGov poll revealed that 22% of UK Christians struggle when it comes to sharing their faith, and that many churches do not teach people how to share their faith.

Mark's Boot Camp teaches in such a way that people are inspired in their evangelism, feeling that they are able to do it well. We've even seen people recommit their lives to Christ because a new spark has been set alight in them.

Even the most experienced people doing evangelism are guaranteed to learn something as the Boot Camp is about practically equipping people. Communication underpins this course, as it's not just about what we say when it comes to evangelism, but how we say it.

We give an introduction to evangelism, explaining what it is and how people respond to the gospel, as well as discussing different ways of communicating the gospel. We help people develop their writing skills so that they are able to convey their testimony stories more effectively. We show participants how to handle people who ask questions and how to answer these questions. We equip attendees to help people say yes to God and to keep going once they've made a commitment.

The course ends with a commissioning service, during which we ask God to send us out empowered by the Holy Spirit.

The meetings provided what I can only describe as a spiritual boost. My love for the Lord and gratitude for the things he has done in my life was noticeably deepened. Totally unexpected and totally humbling.

### Inviting friends to Christian events is always daunting, which is crazy really as we don't have the same fear when we invite people over for coffee!

At this evening of worship, teaching, practical resourcing and praying, Mark will encourage your congregation. He will help attendees understand the purpose of events and feel that they can invite their friends along to the events that are right for them. Each participant will receive excellent resources that have proven to be very helpful for people as a means of prayerfully inviting their friends to events. All this takes place within an environment of worship and prayer.

Designed as a mid-week event, it also works well on a Sunday evening. It could even run as part of a Sunday morning service, although the same basic material would be delivered in a slightly different way in a Sunday morning setting. Whatever the format, I am sure we can make it work for you and your church, and that it will greatly increase your congregation's confidence regarding evangelism. Many churches run this event as a follow-on from the Boot Camp, as another means of equipping, while others run it as a build-up to events such as Reason to Believe, the Life Series and Making a Meal of It.

## The idea is **simple...**

A church spends between three and five days having lots of meals in as many venues as possible, using as many themes and formats as possible. We literally make a meal of the church week! This type of mission works as well in cell or small group style churches as it does in more traditional types of church, regardless of denomination. Making a Meal of It also works well when lots of churches take part together. So why not make a meal of it in your city or town?


Each event ends with a talk delivered by Mark, who uses his humour and thought-provoking chat to unpack the life-changing message of Christianity. Making a Meal of It works well as a reaping event as well as a sowing event (the aim is decided beforehand with church leaders).

Many churches run Mark's Comedy at Christmas event as a follow-on, although in this case the event is called Making a Meal of Christmas. It can also run in conjunction with Mark's Celebrate events, such as Making a Meal of Harvest or Making a Meal of Pancake Day. ## reason to believe

### Is it reasonable to believe...

Providing reasoned answers to frequently asked questions over five evenings



ur **Reason to Believe** event discusses the most frequently asked questions, demonstrating to participants that it is reasonable to be a Christian. Engaging people in a way that causes them to examine the process by which they arrive at conclusions and beliefs means they will be more willing to hear the answers Mark offers as he relates how he arrived at what he believes. Engaging people in their minds and hearts is important, as not all questions people ask are red herrings. They can be genuine hindrances to believing.

#### During these evening sessions, Mark asks:

- Is it reasonable to believe the Bible?
- Is it reasonable to believe in a God you can't see?
- Is it reasonable to believe in a God of love in a world of suffering?
- Is it reasonable to believe that I can just do whatever feels right to me?
- Is it reasonable to believe that Christianity is right?

Experience gained through personal evangelism has given Mark the ability to cover the questions he knows many people are asking. As a result, his answers deal with the broader issues linked with these subjects.

While Reason to Believe is totally evangelistic, the very nature of an apologetics-based course means that it will benefit new Christians, established Christians and those who have yet to decide. Churches have run Reason to Believe as a precursor to Alpha, as Alpha starts where Reason to Believe finishes – with the person of Jesus – so the transition is seamless. Like Alpha, Reason to Believe includes food, a presentation, and discussion in a relaxed and safe environment.

Four fast-paced evenings of humour and multimedia, examining a life of purpose



### Many people find themselves asking, "Who am I?", "What am I here for?", "What happens when I die?" and "How do I make the most of my life?"

Set in a relaxed environment, the Life Series helps those who are exploring the meaning of life to realise that there really is purpose to their lives. Although it is primarily aimed at non-Christians, it has also been a joy to see how it has helped Christians.

Through humour, music, multimedia, interview, discussion and chat (with coffee and cakes), Mark takes guests on a journey through life. Week one presents the idea that we are born for a purpose. Week two presents the concept that we can live like people of purpose, and week three presents the notion that even in death there is purpose. We end the series by presenting the fact that God wants to unlock his purpose in us. The evenings are called:

- Life...before it
- Life...during it
- Life...after it
- Life...unlock it

On the final evening, we offer a relaxed opportunity for people to say yes to God.

While the Life Series was created for midweek evenings in churches, it works just as well on Sunday mornings or evenings, and also lends itself well to a Costa or Starbucks type venue. Churches often run the Life Series before or after Reason to Believe, as it gives guests another opportunity to find out more about the Christian faith. It has also been run as a follow-on from Making a Meal of It with the same idea in mind.

It's a Sunday morning and you have a mixture of Christians and non-Christians within your congregation. Can we speak to both?

Most definitely! Look Closer Sundays do just that. These events can run as a series of evangelistic Sundays that inspire Christians as well as giving clear opportunities for those who aren't believers to respond.

Mark's talks are aimed at all people. In other words, his talks are written in such a way that they connect and apply to people wherever they are on their faith journeys. They contain something for the established Christian, the new Christian and the not-yet Christian. The advantage of doing it this way is that it doesn't look as though we are targeting non-Christians.

One of Mark's strengths is that he is able to build relationships with the friends of church members in such a way that they will love hearing him speak and will come to hear him many times. Look Closer Sundays are a great way to connect these people with the rest of your church community, giving participants fresh opportunities to find out more. Many people who have heard Mark speak at his other events, such as Reason to Believe and Comedy and Christmas, come along to Look Closer Sundays.

### There are many fantastic opportunities to hold family-friendly evangelistic services throughout the year. It's a real shame when we let the years roll by without any proper celebration.

Using the rhythm of the year, our Celebrate events use seasonal festivals to present the gospel through a family-friendly event. The service is fast-moving (lasting a maximum of an hour) and easy to organise. If your budget will stretch, why not have some themed refreshments afterwards?

While these events usually take place on Sundays, they can be adapted for midweek events if that is more convenient. So whether you need a talk for Mother's Day, harvest or Bonfire Night, Mark has something up his sleeve that is entertaining, on theme and clearly presents the gospel. You don't have to use the whole service as a family service; you may just decide to give the Sunday nearest the event in question an evangelistic edge. This has been done a number of times and works well.

Mark is happy to host any of these seasonal celebrations as a one-off event, but it may be worth booking several each year so that they link together, providing continuity and keeping the momentum going.

These events are great for building better connections with your community through schools, kids groups, Messy Church, mums and toddlers groups, Alpha groups and so on.


# Curry Comedy & Christianity

### There is nothing quite like going out for a curry with friends.

Why not make it an evangelistic event that is suitable for anyone with an interest in the Christian faith? At the Curry, Comedy and Christianity event, Mark chats about his 'curry pilgrimage' and the things he has experienced, using these stories to explain why he is a Christian. The evenings are simple in format, involving food and conversation followed by a talk from Mark. The message of Christianity is presented within a very relaxed environment.

These evenings (along with Mark's other comedy events) are great for people who have never been to church before as they involve plenty of fun with a light dusting of the gospel, enabling those who are invited to find out more by chatting to the friends who brought them.

We have hosted this event in more than 50 Indian restaurants around the UK and will use our experience to ensure that your curry night is tailored well to your church. These evenings have been run within churches, but when this is the case we encourage organisers to order the food from a tried and tested Indian restaurant. Our curry nights have also been used to launch the Alpha course.

You could even tie in your event with National Curry Week, which usually falls in October.

a day conference for men. It is honest and challenging but very inspirational, giving men a chance to ask themselves: 'What does God want us to be?' Sometimes churches book it over the Father's Day weekend, and Mark has then spoken at the Father's Day service on the Sunday using the talk from his Celebrate

We will look at what it means to be godly in the home, at church and in the workplace. Using multimedia, lots of laughter, along with bacon butties, pastries and lashings of coffee, this has proved to be a significant day in the lives of many men around the country. We still receive feedback from sessions we hosted several years back.

We have found that running a Curry, Comedy and Christianity evening works well about six weeks after Men Behaving Godly as it is a practical way to take what men have taken from the conference event forward.

While Men Behaving Godly is designed to be a daytime conference, it can also be held in the evening, although this means there is less time to unpack the material. It has also been used as a men's weekend away, which provides more opportunity to think through the issues raised. It's always good to build on that sort of momentum. Some churches have even used this event to launch or relaunch their men's groups.

M ark's Christmas show, Comedy at Christmas, is also known as Making a Meal of Christmas when it takes place after a sit-down Christmas dinner. It is in high demand across the country, with some dates booked up years in advance. The event uses music, comedy and chat to unpack the Christmas message.

Churches and groups of churches have found that Comedy at Christmas gives people an opportunity to come along to a totally different kind of event, despite the fact that they might not come to a standard church service. This event is often held in theatres, sport centres, restaurants and community halls, as well as in church buildings.

Mark has his own set and lights, which create a great atmosphere. Using his experience in stand-up comedy and his observations about Christmas, he presents a 50-minute show that will make audience members laugh and cry while hearing very clearly what Christmas and Christianity is really about. Mark has an amazing bunch of talented singers he can bring along if you would like to include that in the package. Mark has two Comedy at Christmas events, and many churches that have booked it once find that it works so well they want to book it for the following year. Some churches also book Mark's A Christmas Carol the same year as the comedy event, using the comedy as a taster for the carol service. Other churches have booked the Life Series in January and used Mark's Christmas events to launch the series.

Churches work hard year after year to come up with creative themes for their traditional carol services. Mark's take on Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol provides a suitable theme, while preserving the traditional carol service feel.

In the original story, Scrooge is haunted by ghosts of the past, present and future, but he is also given the chance to change. Combining carols with Christmas readings from the Bible, Mark uses four clips from *The Muppet Christmas Carol* to weave in his talk throughout the evening, presenting it as three mini talks. This builds the theme, giving the service purpose and direction. The advantage of this approach is that the talk is an integral part of the service rather than being tagged on at the end. The result is a more rounded service.

While Mark provides a basic template to fit around the talks, there is plenty of space to add your own items, such as dramas, readings and carols.


